TRIBAL TREASURER'S REPORT: JANUARY - MARCH 2014

Introduction

With a deadline of June 30, 2014 approaching rapidly, myself and the Finance Department have been busy in working to complete the 2013 Annual Tribal Audit for the Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe, as well as complete the 2015 Indirect Cost Proposal to be submitted to the U.S. DOI National Clearinghouse. We are also getting ready for the end of the 2nd quarter this year which means grant reporting and draws, as well as the Budget Committee's quarterly review of the programs financial status reports and completion of the 2nd quarter Settlement Fund draws. Our Contracts & Grants Department has been working on a number of grants and starting this month will be working on the ICDBG Project from HUD to support the building of a new fire station on the Reservation and to complete so much needed renovations at the Head Start building. The Tax Department has been busy working

on business licensing requests and working with the Nevada Inter-Tribal Tax Coalition which meets monthly to address tax issues facing all the Tribe in Nevada. One of the big projects underway is evaluating our tax agreement with the State of Nevada to see if we can retain more of the fuel taxes we collect and remit back to the State so as to help with project such as roads building and maintenance.

2013 Audit Update

The 2013 audit has been more complex than in prior years as that as of May 1, 2013, the Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Housing Authority was dissolved and a new Housing Department was created under supervision of the Tribal Administrator. Due to the past management and financial issues involving the Housing Authority, the Council felt that there was no other option than to take over the Housing and to run it under the

Tribe with the strong supervision from the Council and Administrator, as well as the stronger financial controls that the Tribe's Finance had implemented.

Closing out the former Housing Authority's financial records has been a major task for the Housing Department and its staff, as well the auditors handling this closeout. Records had to be located and in many cases this involved the staff having to contact vendors directly to get copies of invoices and other supporting documentation. Additionally while staff from Housing and Finance have been trying to get this completed, there has also been a forensic audit underway to review the Housing Authority's records of the past number of years, as well as to evaluate this records in terms of findings from auditors and HUD. The completion for both the annual audits to be completed, as well as the forensic audit, is projected by the end of June.

Purpose. The purpose of this fund is to assist Fallon Tribal members who are 60 years of age or older with costs associated with an unforeseen health, safety, or home repair which would result in a tribal elder being without the necessities

This is an important note that I wanted to inform the tribal membership because this long and hard process that is being done to get the former Housing Authority's records in order and their final audits completed has a direct bearing on Tribe's 2013 Audit. Since the Tribe officially took over the HUD grants and the Housing Program in May of last year, this means that that 8 months of the

Department’s fiscal records and activity are part of the Tribe’s annual audit. But for the audit to be correct, the Tribe’s auditors need assurance that the ending/closing number of the Housing Authority are correct and accurate before they can be included into our audit. This is necessary to ensure the financial integrity of our financial accounts and to ensure we have accurate numbers to report to HUD through our audit. This process, though, may delay our submission of our own audit to ensure we have the correct financial information, but both my Office and the Housing and Finance Departments are working hard to complete this by the end of June 2013.

Return of HIP Funds


I do have one important notice I

would like to report to the Tribal Membership. For a number of years there has been ongoing issues involving the HIP funds provided by the BIA which were transferred to the former Housing Authority to complete a number of housing projects. In order to protect the Tribe’s standing with BIA, the Tribe in the past couple of years allocated funds from its revenues to cover the HIP projects until we could get reimbursed from the Housing Authority. This week, after consultation with the Housing Department and the accounting firm working with them, we were able to get repaid back the HIP funds for those projects not yet completed and with the Tribe transferred the funds to the Housing Authority over 6 years ago. With the return of the HIP funds, my office can return those allocated funds back into the

Settlement Fund from which they had been obligated from. I would like to thank the Housing Department staff and their consultants who were finally able to identify the source of funds to reimburse the Tribe for the HIP funds and so that our HIP program can work on all the remaining projects to be completed.

Conclusion

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ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUESTS

The Tribal Election Committee is now accepting Absentee Ballot Requests for the upcoming 2014 Regular Election.

Pursuant to the Title 14-Election Ordinance, 14-110-030(b), all requests shall be in writing and notarized by a Notary Public and submitted to the TEC by mail, fax, or hand delivery. All requests for an absentee ballot must be received no later than **seven (7) days** prior to an election. The use of the Absentee Ballot Request Form No. TEF-005 is optional, but other formats/forms must adhere to Title 14 requirements.

Tribal Constitution Article IV, Section 3:
Any eligible voter who provides written notice to the Election Committee may vote by absentee ballot as provided in this Section at an election of the Tribe, if he/she is or expects to be:

- (a) Absent from the reservation/colony because of the nature of his/her vocation, business, or any other unavoidable causes;
- (b) Unable to go to the polling place due to unavoidable causes;
- (c) Enrolled and attending an educational institution; or
- (d) In any branch of the armed forces of the United States of America.

ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUEST FORM

Fallon Paiute Shoshone Tribe Memorial Day Services




The Fallon Paiute Shoshone Tribe welcomed the Fallon VFW # 1028 who conducted a Memorial Day Service in honor of our Veterans.

Healthy Connections: Heatstroke

Heatstroke

Heatstroke is a more serious condition than heat exhaustion. It occurs when the body's temperature becomes dangerously high due to excessive heat exposure. The body is no longer able to cool itself and starts to overheat.

Signs of heatstroke include dry skin, [vertigo](#), confusion, [headache](#), thirst, nausea, rapid shallow breathing (hyperventilation) and muscle cramps. Read more about the [symptoms of heatstroke](#).

Suspected heatstroke should always be regarded as a medical emergency, and you should dial 911 to request an ambulance.

While waiting for the ambulance to arrive you should:

- immediately move the person to a cool area
- increase ventilation by opening windows or using a fan
- give water to drink (if the person is conscious), but don't give them medication, such as aspirin or paracetamol
- shower their skin with cool, but not cold, water (15-18°C); alternatively, cover their body with cool, damp towels or sheets, or immerse them in cool water (not cold)

Left untreated, heatstroke can lead to complications, such as brain damage and organ failure. It's also possible to die from heatstroke.


Avoiding heatstroke

There are steps you can take to reduce the risk of getting heatstroke during a heat wave. These include:

- staying out of the sun during the hottest parts of the day, particularly between 11 am and 3 pm
- if you have to go out in the heat, walk in the shade, apply [sunscreen](#) and wear a hat
- do not leave anyone in a parked car
- avoid extreme physical exertion
- have plenty of cold drinks, but avoid drinks that contain caffeine and alcohol
- eat cold foods, particularly salads and fruit with a high water content
- take a cool shower, bath or body wash
- sprinkle water over your skin or clothing, or keep a damp cloth on the back of your neck
- keep your environment cool




