## NAS Fallon Modernization Plan Expansion Opposition

Dear Tribal Membership:

I wanted to take this time and share an overview of the Fallon Paiute Shoshone Tribe's activities and opposition to the Naval Air Station Fallon base expansion. The Tribe has taken a strong opposition stance with NAS Fallon regarding the proposed activities due to the adverse and detrimental impacts to Fallon Tribal cultural resources. The Tribe is currently in a holding period waiting for NAS Fallon's responses to the comments to the Draft Environmental Impact Statement which were submitted to NAS Fallon in February 2019. The Tribe along with others have been patiently waiting for the Navy responses to the over 3000 comments which responses are expected to be received sometime in September.

As a brief history the United States Navy currently conducts training at Naval Air Station Fallon (NAS Fallon) across an approximately 232,000-acre area. Approximately 200,000 acres of this area was public land that Congress "withdrew" from public access and transferred to the Navy in 1999 for a twenty-year period, which is set to expire in November 2021.

In preparation for the expiration, the Navy has proposed renewal of the withdrawal of the existing base and training area, and withdrawal of an additional 618,727 acres of federal land. The action will require Congressional approval and if approved the withdrawal could take place in 2020 and likely be for at least twenty years. In addition, the Navy is proposing to purchase approximately 65,153 acres of private or state-owned land. In total, the base would expand greatly under the Navy's proposal, from approximately 232,000 acres to more than 900,000 acres. The Navy claims that the amount of training would not increase, but that it would be spread out over a much greater area. The training generally involves use of live munitions from aircraft, including bombs, but also includes ground training.

The areas proposed for renewal and expansion of land withdrawal include areas encompass the heart of our traditional homelands which include but not limited the Stillwater Range (including Fox Peak), the Clan Alpines, Rawhide Hot Springs, Fairview Mountain, Sand Mountain, and Dixie Valley just to name a few. The proposed area includes many sacred areas and sensitive hunting and gathering areas used by our people on a daily basis. The Tribe views the expanded withdrawal of access and associated training as a perpetuation of a long history of the United States damaging the Tribe's homelands and resources, limiting Tribal members' access to those areas and destroying the sacred places we depend on.

Tribal leadership and staff have carefully monitored the proposal and brought in Tribal legal counsel to assist with the process to prepare for legal action if necessary. The Tribe has submitted numerous comments and letters throughout the environmental review process and during the limited face to face consultation meetings with the Navy explained the detrimental impacts that the Navy will have on the irreplaceable cultural resources of our Tribe. The Tribes concerns include but not limited addressing the impacts to our cultural resources which include the loss of access and damage to Tribal sacred sites, failure to rectify past Navy sacred site damage (including but not limited to Fox Peak Mother/Father Stones, Medicine Rock in BRAVO 20, Fairview Mountain), adverse impacts to the protection of our ancestors burials, addressing the health and quality of life impacts from frequent flights over the Reservation, addressing the loss of access to traditional hunting and gathering areas, adverse impacts to endangered species, addressing the increased fire danger and lack of fire remediation from previous NAS Fallon fires, mitigation noxious weed spread, decrease of designated wilderness areas and NAS Fallon's failure to comply with the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). To date the Navy has not performed a cultural resources inventory of the area or provided funding to the Tribe to do so, has been unreceptive to the Tribe's input, and has not proposed any meaningful changes to protect the interests of the Tribe.

Since this action requires Congressional approval, the Tribe has raised its concerns with its Congressional representatives and plans to pursue further discussions, with the goal of eliminating/limiting the withdrawal, demand the completion of a cultural resources inventory of the entire project area prior to expansion as mandated by federal law, guaranteeing regular access for Tribal members, and preventing damage to cultural resources. Elected leaders and staff have repeatedly met with other Tribes, local stakeholders, federal agencies, and the State Historic Preservation Office to raise concerns and seek improvements.

The NAS expansion proposal is nearly universally unpopular. Many groups across the political spectrum, as well as the Nevada legislature and the counties where withdrawal would occur, have expressed opposition. Once the Final Environmental Assessment is released the Tribe will review and determine future actions. It is expected that over the next year, the Tribe will step up these efforts considerably and will inform the membership of changes as they become available.

Please contact the Finance Department to bring your bills current or to make payback arrangements.

Effective as of August 27<sup>th</sup> the Tribe is changing credit card vendor from PayPal to GovPay. It will take approximately one month to install new credit card readers and train staff on the new system.

The Tribe's current Audit contract ends December 31<sup>st</sup>. The Tribe has posted Requests For Proposals due September 27<sup>th</sup>.

The Tribe's current Liability/Property Insurance Broker coverage ends December 31<sup>st</sup>. The Tribe has posted Requests For Proposals due September 24<sup>th</sup>.

The Water Settlement Plan requires that every five years the Tribe review and respond to the Bureau of Indian Affairs on changes to the plan. The review is due October 1st.

The Tribe is presently preparing draft 2020 department/program budgets. These are the budgets that will be reviewed by the Budget Committee for presentation to the Council and public comment. Remember the Tribe's fiscal year is a calendar year, meaning January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>.

The First Day of Fall is September 23<sup>rd</sup>.

# DO NOT PASS! KEEP OUR CHILDREN SAFE

**Never pass a school bus with signals in operation  
It is a Traffic Violation**

### **7-70-110 Improper Passing of a School Bus**

All vehicles shall stop before meeting or passing a clearly marked school bus from any direction, to receive or discharge school children. Vehicles shall not proceed until the school bus start moving or until signaled by the bus driver to proceed. Violation of this sections hall result in a civil forfeiture of not less than \$75.00 nor more than \$150.00.

### **7-10-030 In General**

Violation of this Code subjects the offender to civil forfeiture in the amount set in the civil forfeiture schedule. In addition, suspension of a driver's license may be imposed, as provided in this Title 7, as an additional penalty for offenses listed in Chapter 7-70 of this Title 7.

Gov. Steve Sisolak announced the appointment Tuesday of Walker River Paiute Tribe member Stacey Montooth as executive director of the Nevada Indian Commission.

“Stacey, a member of the Walker River Paiute Nation, has extensive experience in tribal relations in Nevada and understands first-hand the multitude of issues, including health services and K-12 education, facing the 27 tribes in our state,” Sisolak said.

Montooth previously served as a public relations officer for the Reno-Sparks Indian Colony, where she organized community events revolving around the tribe’s unique community celebrations including pow wows, traditional language classes and art demonstrations, and other special events. Montooth also served as the point of contact for day-to-day operation of the tribal government as well as legislation involving key tribal issues, including health care and taxation. From 2009-2013, she served as the Indian Education Liaison for the Churchill County School District.



The Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe Public Utilities District will be providing a new curbside garbage collection service for the FPST community. Applications for the new service will be available at the Finance Department in the administration building. Service is anticipated to begin on Tuesday, September 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Garbage will be picked up on a weekly basis on regularly scheduled pick-up days. Please have your container out by 7:00 a.m. Service will not be provided on major holidays or when extreme weather conditions persist. In these instances, pick up will be rescheduled.

## Things to Remember

- On scheduled pickup days, the container must be accessible, placed within 8 feet of the roadway, and 3 feet away from other objects. The wheels of the container should point toward the residence and lid must open toward the road. (arrows on the cart should point toward the street).
- Please make sure that the lid to your container closes all of the way. Excessive trash must be placed in closed bags and placed next to the container only on scheduled pickup days, limit of two bags.
- Garbage materials should be bagged and placed inside the container. Loose garbage creates litter and can easily be scattered all over the roadway.
- Mixing of solid waste and hazardous waste is NOT permitted in the containers. If hazardous wastes are suspected then the container will not be collected and the customer will be notified.
- Your container is intended for household garbage only. Bulky items may become lodged inside of your trash can and they may prevent your container from being emptied completely or cause trash to fall onto the ground during pickup. If this occurs it is your responsibility to dislodge anything wedged inside of your container and to pick up any trash that may have fallen onto the ground.



## Wood Canyon Fire

*Northeast of Fallon Burns Over 1,400 Acres*

According to the BLM, lightning-sparked wildfire burned over 2,342 acres north of Fallon in the Stillwater Mountain Range. The Wood Canyon Fire started just after 1 p.m. on Tuesday, August 13 about 40 miles northeast of Fallon. It burned through steep, rugged country. Over 170 personnel responded to the fire, multiple air and ground crews. Firefighters made progress by building a line around the fire for containment. As of August 19, a final update was that the Wood Canyon Fire is 100% contained.

The Fallon Tribe has been minimizing the chances of wildfires on tribal lands by adhering to traditional seasonal fire prevention systems of doing control burns, removing hazardous fuels on tribal lands and overgrowth in the tribal wetlands. These practices help clear the sightlines on hunting grounds and protect the tribal wetlands wildlife waterfowl and other

animals. Values at risk include tribal member's homes, watersheds and pasturelands. The tribe's goal is to protect the people and resources that depend on the land.

This is a good reminder to be responsible when planning for a burn whether it is in a burn barrel, yard waste, ditches or a field. Please contact the Churchill County Sheriff's Office at 423-3116 option 1 and the Tribal Police Department at 423-8848 prior to a controlled burn to notify location, contact information, date and time.

**Do not** burn on windy days, **do not** leave the burn unattended, have a source of water nearby including a shovel, and please make sure there is clear ground at least 10' ft around the burn area.

It is your responsibility if your fire escapes, you can be held responsible for costs and can also be held accountable for any injury or loss of property incurred as a result. If burning is not an option, mowing or brush removal can be effective in controlling encroaching shrubs or invasive plants.

As attendees arrived, they visited vendors who were located outside the CLC and inside the tribal gymnasium. They took advantage of the many health and wellness infor-



*No person, shall engage or carry on any trade, business, profession, or commercial activity of any sort for which a license may be required by this Act until a business license is obtained, except as provided under the exemption provisions of this Chapter.*



**DUTIES INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING:**

Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribal Law & Order Code 1-40-070 Duties and Powers of Judges: [If assigned to do so by the Chief Judge, the] Associate Judge of the tribal court shall have the duty and power to conduct all court proceedings, and issue all orders and papers incident thereto, to administer justice in all matters within the jurisdiction of this court. In so doing, they shall :

1. Hold court regularly at a designated time and place on the Colony and Reservation;
2. Hear and decide all cases;
3. Enter all appropriate orders and judgments;

Additionally, if funding allows, attend judicial training sessions as required through the National American Indian Court Judges Association and other training that may be sponsored by the Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe or other agencies. Assist the Court Administrator in submitting reports to the Fallon Business Council, involving the day to day business conducted by the Court

### MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

As per the Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribal Law & Order Code 1-40-020 Qualifications of Judges: All Tribal Court Judges may be any person, Indian or non-Indian, a resident or non-resident of the Colony and Reservation. The Associate Tribal Court Judge shall preferably be an attorney licensed to practice law in one or more of the United States, or someone knowledgeable of Indian Law. A Judge must be a person who:

- (a) Is twenty-one (21) years of age or older;
- (b) Has never been convicted of a felony, unless a full pardon has been received for the offense;
- (c) Has not been convicted of a misdemeanor within the last year excluding non-alcohol related traffic offenses;
- (d) Is willing to attend training sessions for Tribal Judges;
- (e) Completes a background check similar to Tribal law enforcement employees; and
- (f) Is willing to be subject to a drug test.

All judges shall be appointed by the Fallon Business Council.


